International Factoring Association to Hold Teleconference: Issues to Consider When Litigating Against Account Debtors

Pismo Beach, CA– June 22, 2010 – The International Factoring Association (“IFA”) will hold its Account Debtor Litigation Teleconference titled “Issues to Consider When Litigating Against Account Debtors” led by Scot Pierce, Esq., from Brackett & Ellis, P.C.
